

Students from around the state will be given the opportunity to display and compare their work. This competition is held at the Gross Memorial Coliseum on the Fort Hays State University campus on May 2nd and May 3rd. There are many categories for the students to choose from such as: Communication Systems, Power/Energy, Production Systems, and Multi-Pupil Activities.

Any student that has a completed project in the 18-19 school year can enter their work. Entering this competition is completely voluntary. Projects are divided into categories such as woods, drafting, and metals.
