7-12 Math Department By Steve Buresh

In an effort to meet students' needs for mathematics toward high school graduation and post-secondary education, the PHS math department has gone through some changes. Although PHS has a 3 year math requirement for graduation, many 4-year college institutions are pushing for 4 years of high school math credit and these credits need to meet Qualified Admissions requirements. So in addition to strengthening the curriculum already taught to our high school students, we've added Algebra 3 to our list of classes. Algebra 3 is designed for students with a goal of College Algebra but unable to meet placement requirements for the dual-credit course.

The junior high program has also seen changes. This year we've begun the implementation of intervention strategies for our 8th grade at-risk math students. Presently, our interventions are focused on remediating basic math skills, but our goal is to individualize and increase these strategies as we proceed. Revised K-12 math standards will go into effect next year and with these revisions a new state assessment will be created. We are reviewing new junior high textbooks in order to better prepare these students for the assessment and their high school curriculum.

Finally, every year we examine the scores from high-stakes testing like the state assessment and the ACT. We, as a district, recognize that we must continually evaluate and improve what we teach and how we teach it so that all students leaving PHS are on a track for success.
