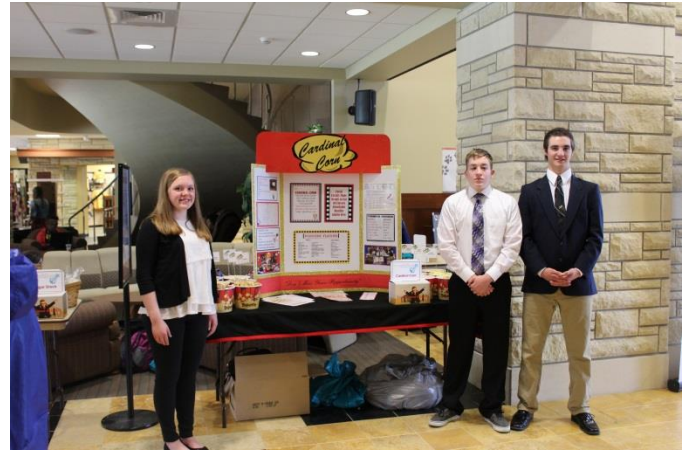
PLAINVILLE HIGH SCHOOL ART CLASS By Jill Wells

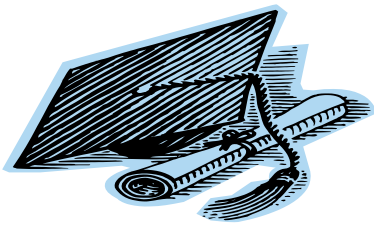
